# **Best Kept Village 2023 New Sponsors**

The Best Kept Village competition has been running in Northern Lincolnshire since 1976. It is organised and run by CPRE Northern Lincolnshire and is open to all small towns and villages within the area.


The competition has proved increasingly popular, with 35 villages and small towns entering in 2022. To encourage more places to enter, new entrants have their entry fee waived for the first year and the best new entrant gets a special award.

Information about this year's Best Kept Village competition has recently been sent out to all town and parish councils. Entries need to be returned to Jenny Haynes, the Best Kept Village organiser, before the end of June.

Judging will be on a range of issues, with the emphasis on community involvement. This year the judges will be visiting between 21 July and 6 August, and each entrant receives a written report identifying strengths and areas for improvement.

## **Brigg Eco Fair**



After several months of planning, on Saturday 18 March the Brigg Eco Fair will be launched. The new Totally Locally Brigg Eco Fair will join the Totally Locally Brigg (TLB) Indie Market for the first time.

It will promote recycling and shopping locally, with environmentally friendly products and services. It offers a range of eco products from local suppliers: toiletries, household goods, a range of food and pet foods, a zero-waste café, repair shops and other promotions.

Held in association with Totally Locally Indie Market and the Fiver Fest, the Eco Fair will be open between 9.00am and 2pm.

The venue is quite appropriate as the Eco Fair can be found in the grounds of Brigg Methodist Church, which has a Silver Award as an Eco Church.

This event also links with established retailers in Brigg offering eco cleaning products and a refill station at Okios on Wrawby Street, Brigg (opposite Boots the Chemists) and a climate change lending library also at Okios.

The Eco Fair is being coordinated by Aime Watson from Slow Circular Earth UK. As a prelude to the event, Andrew Gadd, the regional Circular Economy Coordinator, will introduce the 'Circular Towns' approach and how this relates so well to Saturday's events programme. The talk will be at 2pm on Friday 17 March in the Angel Ballroom, Brigg.

#### **Great British Spring Clean 2023**

Litter remains a scourge of modern society, but the Great British Spring Clean (17 March- 2 April), is an annual opportunity to focus on the problem and take action to deal with it.

Many CPRE members across Northern Lincolnshire already regularly litter pick in their local community and they have also pledged to join in with the Great Spring Clean this year.





Keep Britain Tidy has recently conducted research which reveals that more than 8.5 million adults in the UK have done litter-picking at least once in the past six months.

Therefore, in 2023, Keep Britain Tidy is focusing on the pride 'Litter Heroes' have for their local community.

## Second Green Flag bid for Barton upon Humber

Baysgarth Park in Barton (shown below), already boasts an internationally recognised Green Flag Award and a second area of the town is bidding to add another.

The Humber Bridge Viewing Area (shown right) has been entered for the Award and visitors will have seen recent improvements to the area.

North Lincolnshire Council manage the area but they have recently been helped by the "Friends of Barton Parks" who have agreed to extend their activities within the Humber Bridge Viewing Area.





The Green Flag Award scheme is managed by the environmental charity Keep Britain Tidy, under licence from the Department for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities.

It recognises and rewards well-managed parks and green spaces, setting the benchmark standard for the management of green spaces across the UK and around the world.

North Lincolnshire have further Green Flag Awards for Central Park, Kingsway Gardens, Sheffield Park and Woodlands Memorial Park in Scunthorpe and this year they are also entering Jubilee Park in Ashby.
